Dear Resident

St Ewe Parish Council would like your opinion about the proposed Annexation by St Mewan Parish Council of northern parts of St Ewe Parish at Hewas Water and Lower Sticker.

Cornwall Council is conducting a Community Governance Review which is looking at parish boundaries. St Ewe Parish Council replied to the initial survey by the Review Panel and said that St Ewe was satisfied with its boundaries. This is because St Ewe had not heard that any of its parishioners wanted any change.

St Mewan Parish Council has now proposed a change to St Ewe's northern boundary – also the Grampound with Creed Parish boundary – in order to annex properties in Hewas Water and Lower Sticker, bringing them into St Mewan Parish.

At an extraordinary meeting on 28th May, St Ewe Parish Council discussed the St Mewan proposal. Four parishioners from Hewas Water, four representatives from St Mewan Parish Council and three from Grampound with Creed Parish Council attended and spoke during the Public Session. After much discussion, it was very obvious to St Ewe Parish Council that it needs to know your wishes.

St Ewe Parish Council would like to know whether you want to remain in St Ewe Parish.

Some facts:

- Parish precept (parish council tax) for 2019-20:
 - St Ewe Parish precept for BAND D: £ 24.67
 - St Mewan Parish precept for BAND D: £ 59.79
- It appears that 19 homes and 3 businesses would be affected by the change.
- Planning. As in the past, St Ewe Parish Council will comment on any planning that affects

its parishioners, even if the development is across the parish border. St Ewe Parish Council has a history of listening to its parishioners about any planning that affects them.

- St Mewan Parish Council is holding a drop-in consultation with the people affected by its proposal on Monday, 10th June, Sticker Football Club, 4-7 pm.
- St Ewe Parish Council has a meeting on Monday, 8th July, 7.00 pm, St Ewe Village Hall.
